## Community Benefit Snapshot\*\*



### Community Connections

Parents as Teachers program served **47 low-income families**, with 60 total children. Participating families received **558** home and virtual visits, resulting in improved or maintained family functioning - 94% of families were connected with additional supports.



### Food Access

Provided leadership to the Healthy Hometowns initiative as well as financial and in-kind support to local food banks.



### Behavioral Health

Trained eight coaches and mentors to implement the Coaching Boys into Men and Athletes as Leaders program in their schools. The programs reached 82 youth through 25 sessions resulting in a 94% increase in knowledge and attitudes about healthy relationships.
