Community Benefit Snapshot**



Poverty

Supported **58** individuals in completing the "Getting Ahead" financial literacy and goal setting program. Graduates increased their net assets by \$445, reported a \$919 change in average monthly income and decreased monthly public benefits usage by \$118, post graduation.



Substance Abuse & Recovery

Provided \$10,000 to Mills County Public Health to deliver the Family Matters substance abuse and peer support program, serving 90 individuals and their families in recovery through 100 hours of individual coaching, and provided 95 households with social support throughout the pandemic.



Behavioral Health

Received **922** average weekly calls to 717-HOPE for information and referral to behavioral health providers. Resumed in- person child and adolescent partial hospitalization program, which totaled 1,453 total patient days and average daily census of 7 youth.



Pandemic Response

Hosted 13 vaccine clinics, provided 2,731 COVID-19 tests and cared for 482 patients diagnosed with COVID-19, including 283 patients who were hospitalized.
