Our team provided outstanding care to the Sarpy/Cass communities and across Nebraska. When asked to provide COVID-19 vaccinations, our team organized a streamlined process to vaccinate 23,000 patients. We are continuing our focus on ambulatory care and expanding ASC procedures. We also added a movement disorder program and water therapy. Next year, we will jointly open the Veterans Administration Community Living Center on our fifth and sixth floors.

Youth Mental Health

Supported the launch of the Sarpy County Youth Mental Health Task Force during the 2021- 2022 school year. The Task Force seeks to improve care coordination for school-age children and families through referrals, motivational interviewing and interdisciplinary case management.



Behavioral Health

Tobacco Education and Advocacy of the Midlands (TEAM) partnered with UNMC to create an evidence- based, T.E.A.M. No Vaping prevention curriculum and provided technical assistance to 12 schools on implementing updated policies. T.E.A.M. supported 7 new multifamily housing properties in becoming designated 100% smoke, vape and tobacco-free.

Administered **26,538 vaccines** to protect against SARS- CoV- 2 (coronavirus).

Administered **777** routine immunizations to 544 uninsured or under-insured children and adults.
