### Community Benefit Snapshot\*\*



#### Poverty

Supported **41 individuals** in completing the "Getting Ahead" financial literacy and goal setting program. Graduates increased their net assets by \$3,585; reported a \$1,061 increase in average monthly income and decreased monthly public benefits usage by \$67, post graduation.

#### Substance Abuse & Recovery

Provided **\$10,000** to Mills County Public Health to deliver the Family Matters substance abuse recovery and peer support program, offering social support. Completed 1,700 patient appointments in the Psychiatric Immediate Care Center (PICC) providing access to psychiatric assessment and care for patients experiencing a mental health crisis, who do not require an inpatient admission, but need care sooner than most outpatient clinics can accommodate.



Significantly aided the Council Bluffs community by ensuring food access for vulnerable groups, while also supporting over 90 local vendors and nonprofits through our \$10,000 sponsorship of the 22-week Council Bluffs Farmers Market. This initiative fostered a vital resource network, addressing the nutritional needs of local elders, women and children while empowering local businesses and charitable organizations.
