## Community Benefit Snapshot\*\*



#### Violence

Provided **528 victims** of sexual assault and intimate partner violence with care delivered by specially trained Forensic Nurse Examiners and connected them with community advocates. **Sixteen survivors** of human trafficking were positively identified and treated.



# Social Determinants of Health

**2,126 patients** were provided with community resources and/ or education to address unmet health-related social needs, such as transportation, food or housing assistance through the Community Link program.



#### Housing

144 patients were referred to an onsite housing case manager to prevent eviction and/or find a safe housing placement upon discharge. 102 patients successfully connected with the housing case manager for help with rent and utilities assistance.



### **Poverty**

Supported 175 individuals in completing the Getting Ahead, financial literacy and goal setting program. Graduates reported \$1,480 change in average monthly income, \$7,911 increase in net assets and a \$107/ month decrease in public benefits usage.
