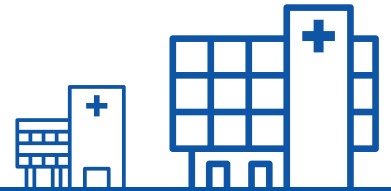

Community Benefit Snapshot**

Behavioral Health:

Provided **\$18,750** to support the BUILD Health Challenge project led by Heartland Family Service. Using the asset-based Self-Healing Community Model, residents of 68111 have formed work groups and will receive training to tackle drivers of poor mental health, such as trauma and lack of access to healthy foods.



COVID- 19 relief:

Continued to serve adults and youth in need of acute psychiatric care by quickly opening **one of the nation's only COVID-19 Psychiatric Units** for individuals that tested positive or were under observation for COVID-19.



Behavioral Health: Provided education to **426 law enforcement and community members** regarding mental health, aging and suicide risk. Trained **384 staff and community members** on Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT) for children and families with severe emotional disturbance.



Workforce Development:

Invested over **\$40,000** in the Empowerment Network to lead diversity and inclusion efforts, such as the Redefine the Game Institute and Step Up youth summer jobs program.
