Community Benefit Snapshot**

Violence:

Ensured the continuation of Second Step curriculum in all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade Health, Family, and Consumer Science classes in the Lincoln Public Schools and continued the violence prevention work by educating physicians and nurses in the Emergency Department about the terminology and techniques used.



Access to Care:

CHI Health St. Elizabeth employees contributed over **133 hours** to **two outreach clinics** on site serving the children and families of the Shrine Hospital.



Access to Care: Follow-up to **179 NICU families** to identify neuro-developmental problems for post-NICU patients. Families receive in-person follow-up visits at three, six, 12, and 18 months of babies life.



Chronic Disease:

Provided **\$50,000** in support to Partnership for Healthy Lincoln to support various programs related to chronic disease.
