It is with immense pride and gratitude that we share with you CHI Health's 2024 Community Impact Report. This report is more than just a collection of numbers - it's a reflection of our unwavering commitment to the people and communities we serve across Nebraska, Iowa, North Dakota, and Minnesota. Over the past year, CHI Health provided \$240,826,838 in community benefit across our ministries. This significant investment underscores our dedication to addressing the needs of our neighbors and to ensuring access to quality healthcare for all. More than 55,000 patients received financial assistance, helping them access essential healthcare services. Our commitment to providing high- value health care during tumultuous times is further evidenced in serving over 292,000 patients who rely on Medicaid for their health coverage, providing vital support to our most vulnerable neighbors.

We recognize that healthcare extends beyond the walls of our hospitals and clinics. We launched universal social needs screening, which provided us with rich insight into the many factors that influence our patients' health, such as food and housing insecurity, lack of reliable transportation and domestic violence. We leveraged those insights to drive our community health investments, totaling over \$1.2M to nonprofits impacting over 191,000 community members. Here are just a few examples of how those dollars are creating healthier communities:

- MICAH House (Council Bluffs, IA) opened the Florence M. Lakin Child Development Center, providing childcare for children whose families require emergency shelter. In its first year, the center served 57 children. MICAH House also provided tornado and flood disaster assistance to 1.388 individuals.
- Lutheran Social Services (Baudette and Park Rapids, MN) delivered 29,819 meals to 585 seniors through congregate dining, curbside pickup, home delivery, and frozen shipped meals. 90% of these seniors indicated that the meals improved their health and 94% who received the home deliveries said that the meals and accompanying safety checks made it easier for them to remain in their home.
- Mercy Housing (Lincoln, NE) supported 100+ low-income residents with stable housing and on-site services such as health screenings, group health classes, an onsite food pantry and food bank deliveries, recognizing that healthy eating and stable housing are two important ingredients for health.

These are just a few stories that show how we are living out our mission. None of this would be possible without the incredible efforts of our dedicated physicians, nurses, staff, volunteers and partners who work tirelessly to serve our patients and communities. Together, we are making a difference in the lives of those we serve. We invite you to explore the full Community Impact Report to learn more about our efforts and the positive impact we are making. Total Community Benefit

Community Benefit is reported in two main categories:

Access to Care through Financial Assistance - \$189.6M (79%) of our total FY24 Community Benefit Investment, including:

- \$48.6M (20%) Unpaid Cost of Uninsured & Underinsured Financial assistance to 196,181 people who were uninsured or underinsured and could not afford to pay for health care services.
- > \$141.0M (59%) Unpaid Cost of Medicaid

The unreimbursed cost of serving 292,983 Medicaid patients.

Broader Community Health - \$51.2M (21%) of our total FY24 Community Benefit was invested in internal and external services, programs and partner organizations to improve community health, including:

- > \$31.1M Health Professions Education
- Staff time investing in future health care professionals, such as precepting residents and student nurses.
- > \$5.0M Community Health Improvement Services Investment in programs and partnerships to provide health education and to improve the overall health of the community.
- > \$9.8M Subsidized Health Services

Clinical programs that provide access to care, despite operating at a loss because they meet an identified community need, such as rural emergency departments, clinics and home health.

- > \$4.4M Financial and In-Kind Contributions
 - Investments in community groups and other not-for-profit organizations with a focus on meeting identified community health needs.
- > \$0.8M Community Building Activities and Community Benefit Operations



CHI Health Nebraska total community benefit \$134,847,511



CHI Health hospitals in Nebraska provided \$134,847,511 in community benefit, including \$97M in financial assistance and subsidized healthcare through Medicaid, supporting 218,871 patients. Broader community health initiatives, including, but not limited to health professions education, community training and education, as well as grants and in-kind contributions, accounted for twenty eight percent of CHI Health Nebraska hospital's total community benefit, or \$37.8M.





CHI Health hospitals in North Dakota provided \$16,914,822 in community benefit, including \$14.6M in financial assistance and subsidized healthcare through Medicaid, supporting 61,406 patients. Broader community health initiatives, including, but not limited to, health professions education, community training and education, as well as grants and in-kind contributions, accounted for 13.6% percent of CHI Health North Dakota hospital's total community benefit, or \$2.3M.



Community Health Improvement Grants are one of the ways our hospitals are partnering with local nonprofit organizations and investing directly in programs and services that address the most pressing health challenges our communities face.

In 2024, CHI Health hospitals in North Dakota awarded \$167,594 in Community Health Improvement Grants impacting over 672 community members.



CHI Health hospitals in Minnesota provided \$11,926,693 in community benefit, including \$7.4M in financial assistance and subsidized healthcare through Medicaid, supporting 39,642 patients. Broader community health initiatives, including, but not limited to, health professions education, community training and education, as well as grants and in-kind contributions, accounted for 38% percent of CHI Health Minnesota hospital's total community benefit, or \$4.5M.

In 2024, CHI Health hospitals in Minnesota awarded \$42,003 in Community Health Improvement Grants impacting over 3,665 community members.



CHI Health hospitals in Iowa provided \$14,849,762 in community benefit, including \$8.7M in financial assistance and subsidized healthcare through Medicaid, supporting 67,872 patients. Broader community health initiatives, including, but not limited to, health professions education, community training and education, as well as grants and in-kind contributions, accounted for 42% percent of CHI Health Iowa hospital's total community benefit, or \$6.2M.



Community Health Improvement Grants are one of the ways our hospitals are partnering with local nonprofit organizations and investing directly in programs and services that address the most pressing health challenges our communities face.

In 2024, CHI Health hospitals in Iowa awarded \$68,988 in Community Health Improvement Grants impacting over 161,625 community members.

About CHI Health

CHI Health is a regional health network with a unified mission: nurturing the healing ministry of the Church while creating healthier communities. The Upper Central Region consists of 28 hospitals, two stand-alone behavioral health facilities, 200 clinics and 12,588 employees across Nebraska, southwest lowa, North Dakota and Minnesota.

In 2024, CHI Health provided \$240,826,838 million in community benefit, including \$189.6M in unreimbursed care for patients with no health insurance, high out of pocket costs and/or Medicaid coverage, helping 348,149 patients.

CHI Health is part of CommonSpirit Health, a nonprofit, Catholic health system dedicated to advancing health for all people. It was created in February 2019 through the alignment of Catholic Health Initiatives and Dignity Health.

CommonSpirit Health is committed to creating healthy communities,

delivering exceptional patient care, and ensuring every person has access to quality health care. With its national office in Chicago, and a team of over 150,000 employees and over 35,000 physicians and advanced practice clinicians, CommonSpirit Health is comprised of approximately 2,200 care sites, including 142 hospitals in 24 states. In 2024, CommonSpirit Health provided \$2.57 billion in community benefit.
