Social Determinants of Health

A \$65,000 investment in Buffalo County Community Partners bolstered community-wide initiatives and facilitated the convening of the Wellbeing Collaborative.

Access to Care

Supported vital services provided by the HelpCare Clinic for individuals who are uninsured and underinsured through a \$20,000 grant.

Violence Prevention

Helped launch a community collaborative to address violence in Buffalo County, enrolling families in a Coaching Program for immediate needs and long-term planning. The Forensic Nurse Examiner (FNE) Program educated emergency department providers and staff to identify signs of intimate partner violence, sexual assault and human trafficking, improving their response to these critical issues.
