Behavioral Health

The Behavioral Health Peer Support program provides patients with emotional support and helps them reach their treatment/ recovery goals. Eighty two percent of patients enrolled in the Behavioral Health Peer Support program reported a significant positive impact.

Healthy Food Access

Nurture Omaha Farm Stands bring fresh, locally sourced produce to low-income seniors and families through seven farm stand locations. A total of 1,457 Senior Farmer's Market vouchers, valued at \$4,371, were matched with health system investment, resulting in \$16,321 worth of locally sourced fresh produce for eligible low-income seniors, women, infants, and children. This initiative significantly improved access to nutritious food for vulnerable populations while simultaneously supporting local farmers.

Violence Prevention

Continued support and expanded partnership with YouTurn, a violence intervention and prevention organization. YouTurn made over 875 community referrals and provided case management to 137 adolescents and young adults at high risk for violence. Plan to launch a hospital-based violence intervention program in 2025.
