Health Careers

Siembra Salud, a collaboration with the Latino Center of the Midlands, is a paid internship program that helped 14 youth with interviewing skills, resume building skill development and 15 health care trainings and certifications, such as CPR and Mental Health First Aid. CHI Health provided four students with scholarships to become Certified Nurse Assistants and two are working at CHI Health.

Health-Related Social Needs

RISE Academy received a \$40,000 Community Health Improvement Grant to support its mission of breaking generational cycles of incarceration through in-prison programming, reentry services, and post-release support across seven Nebraska prisons. Leveraging this funding, RISE Academy's community navigators provided crucial case management, crisis intervention, healthcare referrals, and housing support to 299 individuals.

Behavioral Health

Tobacco Education and Advocacy of the Midlands (TEAM) successfully supported 142 multifamily housing properties in transitioning to 100% smoke, vape, and tobacco-free environments. This initiative is creating healthier living spaces for all.
