Behavioral Health

Tobacco Education and Advocacy of the Midlands (TEAM) successfully supported 171 multifamily housing properties in transitioning to 100% smoke, vape, and tobacco-free environments. This initiative is creating healthier living spaces for all.

Violence Prevention

The Forensic Nurse Examiner (FNE) Program provided education on violence identification and supported FNE training. The program utilized 18 FNEs for 24/7 coverage, engaged 8 hospitals in teleSANE, and served 659 survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking through 434 identified cases.

Access to Food

A Community Health Improvement Grant, which provides annual funding to community organizations addressing local health needs, was awarded to NeighborGood. The \$20,000 grant supports the food pantry in providing access to nutritious food to the community.
