Care Coordination

Supported the launch of the Community Response program which served **30 families** in need during its first year. Most common resources requested were utilities, housing and financial assistance.



Maternal & Child Health

Provided 174 home visits and placed 72 referrals for childcare, financial and nutrition assistance, etc., through Growing Great Kids, in partnership with Southeast District Health Department.



COVID-19 Response

Collected and processed 307
COVID-19 tests, administered
5,710 vaccine doses and provided 93
monoclonal antibody infusions
to treat patients with COVID-19.
