Food Access, Resilience & Healthy Families

Community Benefit Snapshot**



Food Access

Provided **\$6,800** to Adams & Taylor County Food Pantries for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables.



Supporting Schools

Conducted **17 trauma-informed practice trainings** reaching 89 educators. 144 hours of Mental Health consultation were provided to parents, educators and other youth-serving providers.



Community Connections

Parents as Teachers program expanded to serve **40 low-income families, with 62 total children**. Participating families received 439 home and virtual visits, resulting in improved or maintained family functioning. 82% of families were connected with additional supports.



School Community Connections for Mental Health

Connected teachers with chronically absent students through technology, which resulted in a **7% increase in school attendance** among students.
